understanding of social information effects on donation behaviour*

The Selection Committee unanimously agreed that Dr Teunenbroek's dissertation made significant original contributions to the field of non-profit and voluntary studies by highlighting the importance and influence of social innovation on donor behaviour.

Dr Teunenbroek's methodological approach was rigorous with impressive data sets from multiple sources, including experiments with students, survey data from online crowd-funding participants in the Netherlands, and online experiment data from UK. The complexity of research is constantly increased within the four single studies building the dissertation.

The selection committee consisted of Dr Sheila Cannon (Chair, Trinity College Dublin, Ireland), Dr Georg von Schnurbein (University of Basel, Switzerland), Dr Grace L. Schultz (Cleveland State University, USA), Dr Thang Truong Thi Nam (National Economics University, Vietnam).
